Prior to his time at Osceola County, he spent 15 years in the Army as a Reserve Officer in the Combat Engineering Branch. Mr. Atkins has also worked in the consultant industry in the CM/CEI industry.

Frank O'Dea serves as the FDOT District 5 Construction Engineer. He is responsible for all construction activities within the nine county Central Florida Region, which includes Marion, Sumter, Flagler, Lake, Brevard, Seminole, Orange, Volusia and Osceola Counties. As part of its Work Program, FDOT District 5 has undertaken a growing number of design-build road and bridge projects, which Mr. O'Dea and his staff are currently managing. The District 5 Office will also be overseeing the construction of the Central Florida Commuter Rail, the first D/B Rail Project in Central Florida.

He has decades of hands-on and leadership experience (including 20+ years of active duty naval service) in infrastructure and facilities management. His experience includes budgeting and resourcing, planning, design and construction, operation, maintenance and demolition.
